#### Where are we now?

New Surrey Performing Arts Library started operations on 22 August 2022. We got off to a good start with all prior reservations of stock made with Surrey Libraries being seamlessly handled by NewSPAL and all the systems working well. Inevitably, with a completely new IT system there has been the odd glitch during the first year of operations but, thanks to the goodwill and patience of our loyal patrons, these have been resolved without any significant inconvenience to users.

Every month has seen an increase in registered users (both groups and individuals), including, as we hoped, an increasing number of groups from outside Surrey. We currently have 260 registered music groups and 58 drama groups but only 116 individual members. For NewSPAL to be financially sustainable in the long term, it needs to substantially increase the income from the hire of sets (choral,

orchestral and plays) and, to keep charges down, that can only come from more groups from around the country registering and borrowing from NewSPAL.

Our operating costs - mainly librarians' salaries, property costs (we pay to Surrey a proportionate share of the property-related costs of Ewell Library for the space we occupy) and IT costs - are largely fixed and predictable (although only likely to increase with inflation) while our income fluctuates widely from month to month, tracking the borrowing pattern of the choirs, orchestras and drama groups who rely on the collection. Our income is not (yet) covering our operating costs so the key in the coming year is to continue to increase usage so that, by the end of the two-year trial period agreed to by Surrey County Council, we can demonstrate that NewSPAL is financially secure.

Of course, we have always benefitted from the generosity of our supporters with donations and (in one case a substantial legacy) and if you think you can help NewSPAL financially, there are links from the NewSPAL website (www.newspal.org.uk) to enable you to do so.

# **New Trustee - Su Kingsley**



In the last newsletter we invited interest from people who might like to become a trustee of NewSPAL. Step forward existing volunteer **Su Kingsley** who joined the trustee board in March.

Su has had a varied career, much (but not all) being concerned with health and the delivery of health services including as a Director of the SE London Health Commission, responsible for planning and commissioning health services across the London Boroughs of Lambeth, Southwark and Lewisham, and later as a non-executive Director of the North Middlesex Hospital in Enfield. Since retiring she has devoted much more time to music-related activities - she is a keen violin player. She has a special interest in chamber music but also plays with two orchestras. As a NewSPAL trustee Su is taking a particular interest in how best to promote our large chamber music collection and expand our orchestral and choral collection. One of her first jobs is to plough through a large donation of orchestral sets from a London orchestra to decide which sets would be useful new additions to the NewSPAL collection.
